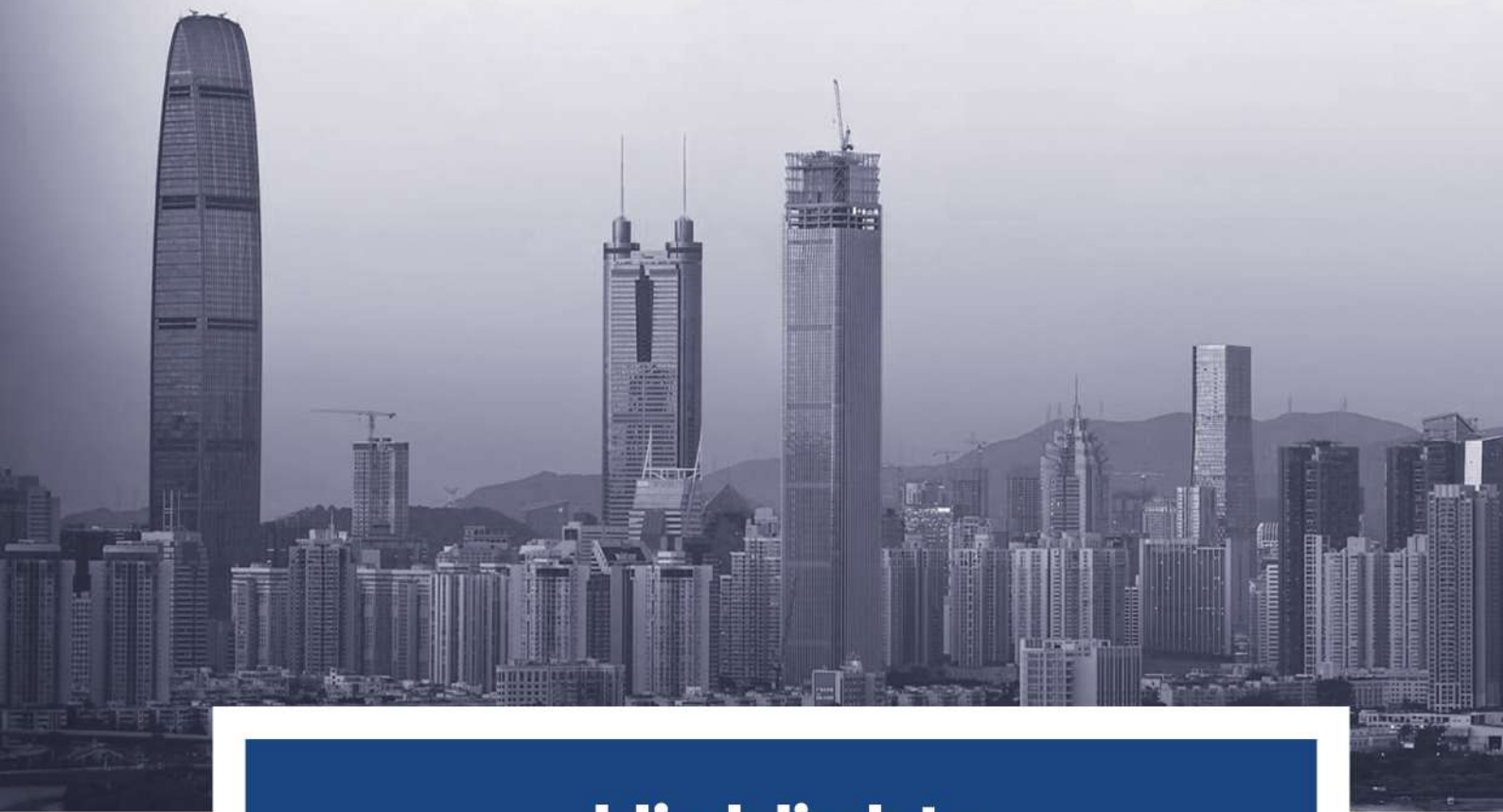

Participation in the Asia ADR Summit 2024



On 26–27 July 2024, VTA participated in the Asia ADR Summit 2024 held in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia. The conference, themed “Beyond Boundaries: Asia’s Rise in Global Dispute Resolution,” was jointly organized by the Asian Institute of Alternative Dispute Resolution (AIADR), the International Arbitration and Mediation Centre (IAMC), and the China International Economic and Trade Arbitration Commission (CIETAC).

The event brought together over 100 leading ADR experts to advance Asia’s role in global dispute resolution. Mr. Pham Xuan Sang, President of VTA, and Ms. Dang Dieu Phuong, VTA’s Director of External Relations, attended the conference and engaged in meaningful discussions with ADR professionals regarding arbitration in Vietnam.

Collaboration with the Indian International Arbitration Centre (IIAC)

On 26 July 2024, in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia, within the framework of the Asia ADR Summit 2024, VTA and IIAC signed a Cooperation Agreement. The signing ceremony was witnessed by the Asian Institute of Alternative Dispute Resolution (AIADR) and international ADR experts.

IIAC was established under the Indian Parliament Act of 2019 with the aim of becoming a leading institution in arbitration and other Alternative Dispute Resolution (ADR) methods. VTA shares a similar mission

of providing a prestigious and effective commercial dispute resolution mechanism to serve the Vietnamese business community.

This agreement seeks to foster the development of ADR methods in Vietnam, India, and across Asia, including organizing seminars, training programs, and experience-sharing activities in international dispute resolution. This significant step further strengthens the roles of both VTA and IIAC within the global ADR network.

Cross-Border Cooperation on Mediation and Arbitration between Guangxi (China) and Vietnam

On 2 August 2024, in Nanning, Guangxi, China, VTA participated in the Cross-Border Cooperation Signing Ceremony with the presence of representatives from the China Council for the Promotion of International Trade (CCPIT) Guangxi Sub-Council, Baise Arbitration Commission, and the Hanoi Mediation Centre.

The cooperation agreement aims to promote fair and transparent resolution of commercial disputes between Vietnamese and Chinese enterprises. The primary goal of this Tripartite Cooperation Agreement is to leverage each party's unique strengths, foster mutual trust and friendship, and facilitate fair and transparent dispute resolution for businesses in both countries.

Following the signing ceremony, representatives visited the Joint Secretariat Offices of CCPIT Guangxi Sub-Council, Baise Arbitration Commission, VTA, and the Hanoi Mediation Centre, located in the China-ASEAN Business Centre at No. 10 Pingle Avenue, Liangqing District, Nanning City, Guangxi Province, China.

On 2 August 2024, Mr. Pham Xuan Sang, President of VTA, along with the delegation, visited the China Council for the Promotion of International Trade (CCPIT) Guangxi Sub-Council. Together with leaders from CCPIT Guangxi, the Standing Committee of the Guangxi People's Congress, Baise City Government, and Guangxi University for Nationalities, they attended the Cross-Border Cooperation Signing Ceremony on Mediation and Arbitration between Guangxi (China) and Vietnam.

In his speech, the President of VTA emphasized the significance of international cooperation in the field of arbitration and mediation, particularly between Guangxi—a region bordering four Vietnamese provinces—and Vietnamese enterprises. He also highlighted the role of the 1958 New York Convention in recognizing and enforcing arbitral awards between the two nations, facilitating cross-border commercial dispute resolution.

Quoting the saying, “A journey of a thousand miles begins with a single step,” the VTA President expressed his belief that VTA's participation in this signing ceremony marks the beginning of a strategic, trustworthy, and meaningful partnership in mediation and arbitration between China and Vietnam.



6 Collaboration with the Indonesian Dispute Board (IDB)

On 9 October 2024, in Ho Chi Minh City, VTA and IDB signed a Cooperation Agreement to promote business dispute resolution in Vietnam, Indonesia, and the broader Asian region.

IDB, also known as Dewan Sengketa Indonesia, is an independent organization providing arbitration, mediation, and dispute resolution services in Indonesia. This collaboration encompasses key activities such as: Inclusion of arbitrators from both institutions into each other's panels; Joint organization of seminars and training programs; Research and

publication of materials on international arbitration; and Facility and venue support for arbitration hearings in both Vietnam and Indonesia.

This agreement signifies a shared commitment to enhancing the effectiveness of commercial dispute resolution, contributing to a transparent, efficient, and fair business environment across the region. VTA and IDB emphasize initiatives aimed at supporting Vietnamese and Indonesian businesses in resolving disputes effectively.

Participation in the Hainan Free Trade Port Legal Week

From October 17–20, 2024, VTA, led by Ms. Dang Dieu Phuong, Vice President of VTA, participated in the Hainan Free Trade Port Legal Week in Haikou, China. The event brought together legal experts and international arbitration organizations, providing opportunities to share knowledge and promote commercial cooperation across regions.

During the event, VTA engaged in discussions on legal services and

commercial dispute resolution mechanisms, including ad hoc arbitration, and explored collaboration with the eBRAM International Online Dispute Resolution Centre (Hong Kong). Additionally, VTA visited the Hainan International Arbitration Court (HIAC) and held meetings with Jingshi Law Firm and Eastgos Law Firm, paving the way for potential legal cooperation and practical arbitration opportunities between the two countries.

Collaboration with the Hainan International Arbitration Court (HIAC)



On 18 October 2024, in Hainan Province, China, VTA and HIAC signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU), marking the beginning of a strategic partnership between the two institutions.

HIAC, restructured from the Hainan Arbitration Commission, aims to support the development of the Hainan Free Trade Port and position Hainan as an international arbitration hub targeting the Pacific and Indian Ocean regions. During the signing ceremony, Mr. Wang Xuelin, President of HIAC, welcomed Ms. Dang Dieu Phuong, Vice President of VTA, and the delegation.

Both parties emphasized the role of arbitration in building a sustainable legal business environment.

Under the MOU, VTA and HIAC commit to cooperating on: Nomination and recognition of arbitrators; Organizing international arbitration activities; Sharing facilities and resources; and Establishing a joint arbitration mechanism.

This partnership paves the way for long-term cooperation, enhancing the capacity to resolve commercial disputes between Vietnam and China.

In conversation with Mr Pham Xuan Sang, the President of Vietnam Traders Arbitration Centre (VTA)

Q: Could you share Vietnam's achievements after nearly 40 years of Doi Moi (Renovation), and the role of the private sector in Vietnam's development?

A: Well, after 40 years of Doi Moi—also known as "Renovation"—Vietnam has truly transformed itself. Doi Moi was a series of transformative economic and political reforms launched in 1986, aimed at transitioning from a centralized, state-controlled model to a socialist-oriented market economy. These reforms opened up the country to market mechanisms, encouraged private enterprise, and deepened Vietnam's integration into the global economy.

For perspective, GDP has risen from approximately \$26.3 billion in the early days of Doi Moi to \$430 billion by 2023, with GDP per capita reaching around \$4,200. And you know, the private sector's been at the heart of this change. As of 2024, there are over 930,000 businesses operating across the country—that's more than 10 times the number back in 2004, when we had only about 92,000. The private sector now accounts for more than 40% of our GDP, employs 85% of the workforce, and contributes over 30% of total social investment. The government has supported this transformation by enacting legal reforms, simplifying procedures, and fostering a more transparent and fair business environment. Clearly, the private sector is driving innovation, boosting productivity, and creating jobs.

Q: How has commercial arbitration developed in Vietnam, especially after the implementation of the Law on Commercial Arbitration?

A: Arbitration in Vietnam actually goes way back, starting in the 1960s along with the economic contract reforms. Back then, arbitration not only resolved disputes but also managed economic contracts. But from 1994, as we entered the Doi Moi era and opened up internationally, arbitration was redefined as a professional social organization solely focused on dispute resolution—it no longer had any state management role.

The Ordinance on Commercial Arbitration in 2003 and the Law on Commercial Arbitration in 2010 were major milestones. These laws made arbitration a more attractive option for traders, entrepreneurs, especially foreign investors. Joining the New York Convention in 1995 was a game-changer—it meant that arbitral awards made in Vietnam would be recognized internationally, which boosted trust and assurance for foreign investors.

On 1 December 2024, in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia, Mr. Pham Xuan Sang, President of VTA, engaged in an in-depth dialogue with AIADR.

The discussion focused on the development of commercial arbitration in Vietnam as the country's economy continues its transformation nearly 40 years after Đổi Mới. The interview, led by Mr. Sagar Kulkarni, Chairman of ESC, AIADR, was featured in AIADR's publication, "ADR Centurion".

During the exchange, the VTA President shared VTA's strategic directions for enhancing the position of Vietnam's commercial arbitration on the international stage. He also reiterated VTA's commitment to advancing Alternative Dispute Resolution (ADR) methods.

This event marks a significant milestone in positioning VTA as a trusted partner within the Asian arbitration community.

Strategic Partnership with the Institutional Innovation Bureau of the Kunming Pilot Free Trade Zone

On 9 December 2024, VTA signed a Strategic Cooperation Agreement with the Institutional Innovation Bureau of the Kunming Pilot Free Trade Zone in Yunnan Province, China.

The agreement aims to promote commercial dispute resolution between Vietnam and Yunnan, laying the groundwork for sustainable cooperation between the two regions. This event is part of the activities implementing the Vietnam–China Joint Statement issued during Chinese Premier Li Qiang's visit to Vietnam in October 2024.



The agreement emphasizes strengthening experience exchange, providing facility support, training arbitrators, and developing cross-border commercial arbitration mechanisms. This strategic step allows VTA to expand its capacity and reinforce its position in the international arbitration landscape.

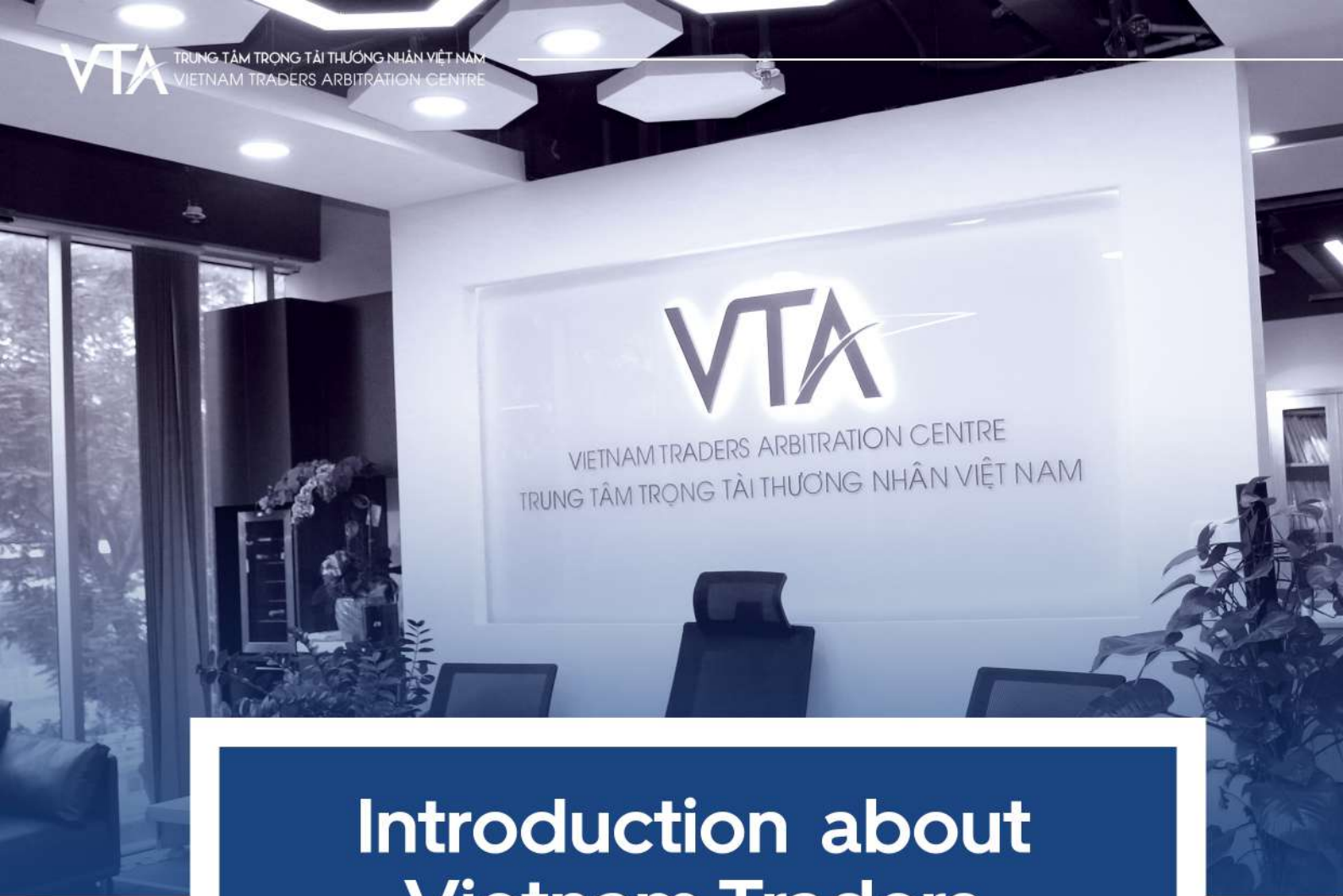
The visit provided an opportunity for the students to gain insights into Vietnam's commercial arbitration landscape and the

English version:

“Any dispute arising out of or in relation with this contract shall be resolved by arbitration at the Vietnam Traders Arbitration Centre (VTA) in accordance with its Rules of Arbitration”.

Vietnamese version:

“Mọi tranh chấp phát sinh từ hoặc liên quan đến hợp đồng này sẽ được giải quyết bằng trọng tài tại Trung tâm Trọng tài Thương nhân Việt Nam (VTA) theo Quy tắc tố tụng trọng tài của Trung tâm này”.

VTA was established in response to the expectations of the Vietnamese business community for a dispute resolution mechanism that comprehends the cultural and business environments of each nation, while adhering to international dispute resolution standards.
